### **General Information about the Centre:**

- Each tour should have no more than 50 participants.
- **Small Groups:** Due to the high volume of requests for tours, interaction with a Holocaust survivor speaker is only provided to groups with a **minimum of 20 people**. Groups between **12 and 20 people** will be offered a guided museum tour led by a museum educator which includes a brief historical overview, thematic film with discussion, and digitally recorded Holocaust survivor testimony with discussion. Groups of **12 people or less** are welcome to make an appointment during our regular business hours to tour the museum on their own. To check availability of museum, please contact the admin office at: 416-635-2883 x5153. **Regrettably, due to regularly scheduled tours and space restrictions, walk-ins cannot always be accommodated.**
- A visit is free of charge, however a \$3 donation per student is appreciated. We accept cheques or cash.
- A short biography of your survivor speaker will be sent to you upon visit booking; please encourage your students to prepare questions for the survivor speaker prior to the visit.
